A special welcome to two new members of the Greenvale staffing team. Mrs Clark joins the teaching team and will be responsible for teaching our Year 5 class during the next academic year.

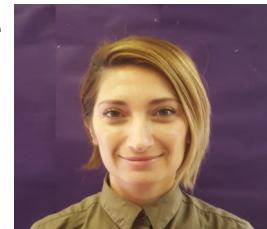

Healthy Tuck Shop

As many of you will remember, at the end of last term, a number of children were involved with the running of a Healthy Tuck Shop which ran during a Thursday break time. Items for sale included fresh fruit pots, popcorn and flavoured milk. This proved very popular with the children.

We are pleased to inform you that we will be continuing with the Healthy Tuck Shop in the Autumn term during a Thursday break time. Each item is priced at 50p and children are responsible for bringing their money to school and keeping it safe either on their person or in their bag.



Pupil Premium

Even though the government have introduced Free School Meals for all infant pupils, it is vital that parent / carers in receipt of benefits still register. Failure to do this will have a detrimental effect on pupil funding.

Did you know that for a number of years, Greenvale has had the fewest families claiming the Pupil Premium in Croydon? This has a huge impact on the amount of funding that the school receives and is vital in ensuring that those children who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium are provided with the necessary support required. The Pupil Premium provides a lump sum of money directly to the school to support your child's education.

If you are entitled to Free school meals through the type of benefits you are receiving, then please contact the school office and they will give you a form to complete, or if you are unsure whether you are entitled, you can now check yourself on the following website – www.fsm.lgfl.net.

Croydon Council use a different method of checking. Instead of parent / carers having to provide documentary proof of their existing benefits every six months to prove entitlement for Free School Meals, we will now have access to a government hub system which will automatically check entitlement using some basic data. You will not need to provide any further information unless the hub is unable to confirm entitlement, in which case, it will be necessary to ask for evidence to be supplied in the usual way.

The Sandpiper Awards

At Greenvale we pride ourselves on children having a sharp metal recall of number facts. The expectation is that by the end of year 4, children can confidently recall all of their times tables and corresponding division facts. This knowledge is essential if children are able to then have a full understanding of more complex operations taught in year 5 and year 6.

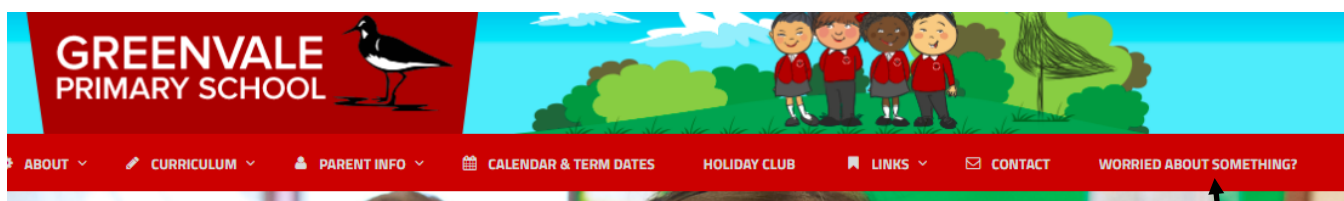
